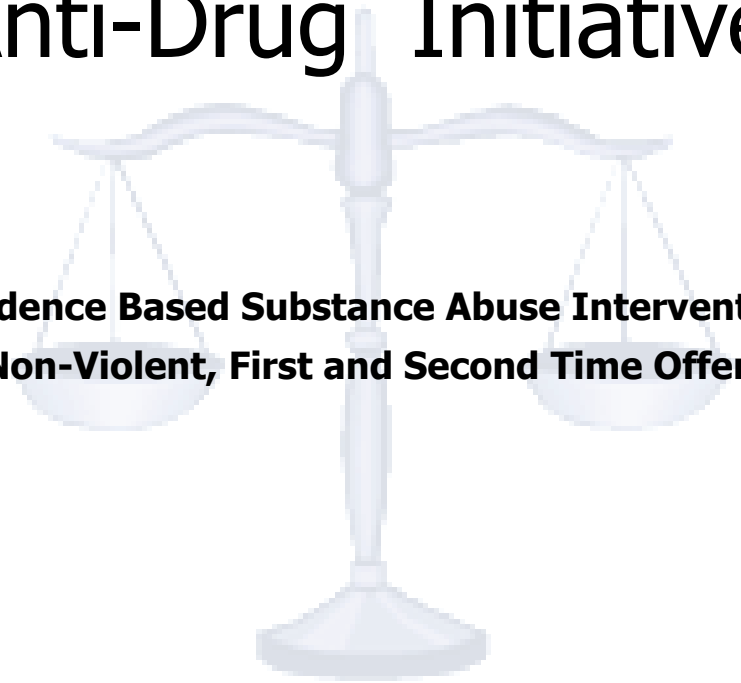

Online ADI Paves A New Way!



Program Overview The Anti-Drug Initiative (ADI) is a web-based diversion program for non-violent first and second time drug offenders. ADI is offered only to drug possession arrestees with no prior felony convictions. Random urinalysis is conducted each week that the client is enrolled in the program.

ADI is offered by Stewart-Marchman-Act Behavioral Healthcare (SMA), a non-profit headquartered in Daytona Beach. ADI has been provided to more than 10,000 defendants in Florida's seventh judicial circuit since 1999. ADI is self sustaining through defendant fees.

How the Program Works ADI is a diversion program based upon Brief Motivational Enhancement Therapy. MET was developed for use in the National Institute on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism's (NIAAA) Project Match.

ADI consists of an online intake session followed by six (6) online treatment sessions that are monitored and guided by qualified, professional counselors. Program counselors also provide telephone consultation to address client's individual needs. Random urinalysis is conducted on a weekly basis, and participants are required to submit to a minimum of four consecutive, acceptable, random, urinalysis tests in order to complete the program successfully.

What Are the Benefits of an Online Program?

- ◆ ADI intervention specifically targets the criminal offense.
- ◆ It can be completed from home
- ◆ Website is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week
- ◆ ADI reduces recidivism

What Is the Defendant Required to Do?

Successful completion of the ADI program requires the following:

- Four (4), acceptable, consecutive, random, urinalysis tests;
- Completion and approval of an online intake followed by six (6) online sessions;
- Complete and submit several required forms to the assigned ADI Counselor.

Successful completion results in "no filing" on the referring charge by the State Attorney's Office. Failure to complete all requirements of the program or any continued drug use results in removal from diversion status.

One Year Post Completion Re-Offense Rates A random sample of 8,399 cases discharged from ADI from program inception through December 31, 2008 reveals that only 24.9% of successful ADI program completions were re-arrested after one year compared to 40.2% of those who did not complete the program.

Specific to drug related crime, the one year re-arrest rates on felony drug possession charges were 3.92% and 7.78% respectively for successful completers and non-completers. Misdemeanor drug arrests, including DUI, were 6.50% and 8.67% respectively for successful and unsuccessful completers.
